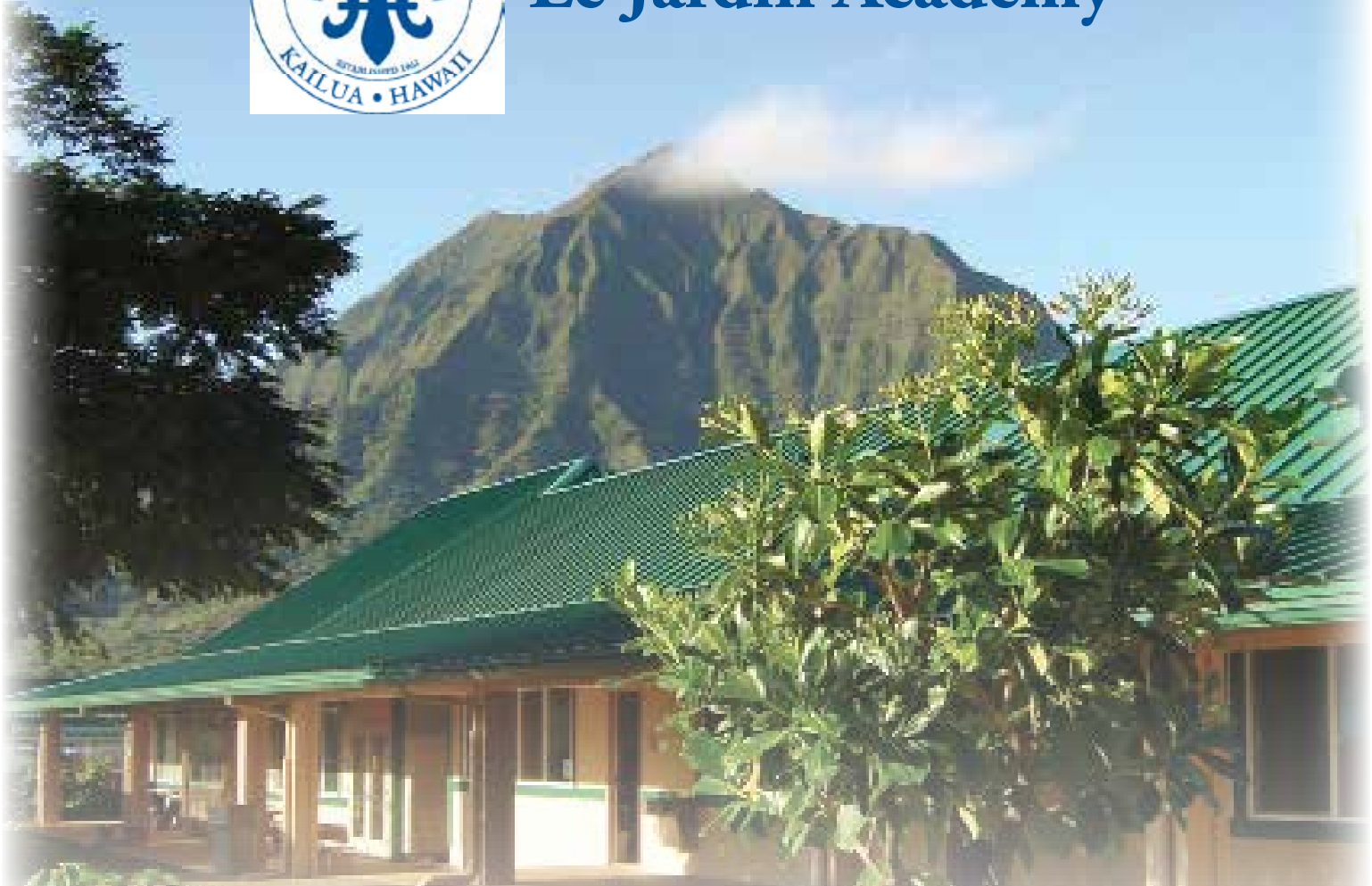

Le Jardin Academy is a nurturing, vigorous learning community. Our college preparatory program strives to create curious, active learners who excel scholastically and have the opportunity to develop their personal skills and talents.

Students are supported in learning to lead balanced, healthy lives, to appreciate the arts, and to value the diverse perspectives of other people and cultures.

Our goal is to develop knowledgeable, responsible, and caring young people of character who help to create a more peaceful and sustainable world through understanding, stewardship, and respect.

School and Community

Le Jardin Academy (LJA) is a PK-12 independent co-educational day school founded in 1961 as a preschool. By 1977, the program had expanded to include grades PK-8. In 1999, the school moved to its current location. The high school was added in 2002, and we graduated our eleventh senior class in 2016. We currently enroll over 800 students primarily from the Windward side of Oahu. Le Jardin Academy is the first school in Hawaii, and one of only a few schools in the United States, authorized to offer the full International Baccalaureate (IB) continuum which includes the Primary Years Programme (grades PK-5), the Middle Years Programme (grades 6-10), and the Diploma Programme (grades 11-12).

School Profile

Curriculum

All students who attend Le Jardin Academy participate in the IB program appropriate to their grade level, PYP (PK-5), MYP (6-10), DP (11-12). The IB programs emphasize inquiry learning and the development of higher level critical thinking skills. Students study a second language from PK to grade 12, and there is a heavy emphasis on international-mindedness in all courses. In grades 9 and 10, all students study the eight subjects indicated in the MYP hexagon. Completion of the MYP Programme entails successfully participating in this program in all eight subjects, culminating with the personal project. The Middle Years Programme is designed to prepare students for the rigor of the Diploma Programme in grades 11 and 12. Students in our upper school complete the following requirements:

Grading System

Students in grades 9 and 10 are assessed using IB MYP criteria and the IB 1-7 marking scale. There are two semester marking periods per year. Grade point averages (GPAs) are calculated by year and are not reflective of a cumulative GPA. Students in grades 11 and 12 are also assessed using the IB 1-7 marking scale. Their GPAs are calculated at the end of each semester and are cumulative for the two year program. Students who choose to take non IB courses will receive a pass/fail mark for that course. It is the policy of Le Jardin Academy not to rank students.
